



Summer Elise Bergerson was born on July 22, 2003, to Brian and Amber Bergerson in Norman, Oklahoma. She was a spunky little girl who grew into a beautiful young woman. She was passionate and loved her family, her friends, and her pets. Despite being diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia in May 2017, she continued to live life to the fullest. She was a fierce competitor, which prepared her for her battle with leukemia.

It was often stated that if Summer would not have lost her beautiful red hair, no one would have known she was sick. She regularly attended school and her Wednesday night youth group in between her chemotherapy treatments. She continued to do it all, even though there were some challenges along the way.

Summer rang the bell signaling the end of her treatment on September 26, 2019, and quickly moved past that 28-month journey to living a healthy, beautiful life. She resumed the normal life of a teenager, hanging out with friends, going to youth group, working, and attending prom. In May 2021, she graduated high school from Santa Fe High School in Edmond, Oklahoma, where she lived her entire life. She found her own way on her own terms, never holding back. She followed her heart and took off to Gunnison, Colorado, to attend Western Colorado University as one of only 470 freshman. She was loving it!

Unfortunately, her leukemia returned during her first semester in college. She returned to Oklahoma to begin her fight again. She fought so hard but was called home to be with Jesus on June 15, 2022.

Summer's life has impacted many, and her friends and family have joined together to create a scholarship in her name so that other survivors will have the chance to experience the joy and freedom of college as Summer did during her time in Colorado.

- Scholarship payments will be made directly to the recipient's school.
